RENOVATIONS COMMENCE AT 1515 R STREET Loyal Brothers Pledge More Than \$2.4 Million to Campaign

Construction on the Alpha Tau Chapter house began in mid-December, and we are excited to begin this new phase in the chapter's history. A well-renovated chapter house will be an asset for years to come and a symbol of the loyalty of Beta alumni. This value is sensed by the University community and will attract individuals with a desire to see Alpha Tau grow and succeed. CONSTRUCTION BEGINS AT CHAPTER HOUSE

The undergraduate members moved out of the chapter house in mid-December. Immediately following their departure, Cheever Construction began to stage their construction work. In the past few weeks, asbestos abatement began and the contractors have started ordering materials. This preemptory, but important, stage will set the scene for future renovations that include:

- Convert existing rooms to a suite-style living concept, with separate educational and sleeping spaces
- Necessary installation of a fire-suppression system to ensure the safety of the chapter
- Significant upgrades to the plumbing, electrical, and mechanical systems
- Bathroom and kitchen modification and upgrades
- Create a handicap-accessible student living unit

While several Brothers have paid their pledges in full or "front-ended" their contributions, our current cash flow projection indicates we'll need to begin borrowing in March or April to keep the construction on time.
